



Speaker **Madison Adams**

Madison Adams is a sow farm success leader with Hord Farms, supporting sow farm teams and daily production success across the organization. With nearly 11 years of experience at Hord Farms, she brings a well-rounded background in sow production, research, nurseries, and finishers. Adams is passionate about building strong, confident teams through clear training, accountability, and consistent animal care. Outside of her daily work demands, Madison can often be found balancing life on her own small farm while taking on multiple home renovation projects.



Speaker **Glen Arnold**

Glen Arnold is a professor with The Ohio State University and serves as an Extension field specialist in the area of manure nutrient management application. His research efforts have been to move livestock producers and commercial manure applicators toward applying manure to growing crops such as corn, wheat, and forages to capture more of the manure nutrients and extend the manure application season.



Speaker **Andréia Arruda, DVM**

Andréia Arruda, DVM, is an associate professor in the Department of Veterinary Preventive Medicine at The Ohio State University, specializing in veterinary epidemiology, swine health, and biosecurity. Her research focuses on infectious disease surveillance, outbreak preparedness, and the use of innovative tools, including network modeling to strengthen animal-health systems. Arruda has authored more than 70 peer-reviewed publications and has led or collaborated on more than 40 funded research projects supported by USDA, the National Pork Board, National Institutes of Health, and industry partners. She is a frequently invited speaker at the American Association of Swine Veterinarians annual meeting and the Leman Swine Conference. Arruda continues to support the Ohio pork industry through applied research, disease surveillance efforts, and her ongoing collaboration with the Ohio Pork Council.




Speaker Jorge Cajamarca, DVM

Jorge Cajamarca, DVM, is a technical services senior specialist with PIC. He provides professional services and support to PIC customers and partners in a way that improves the probability, profitability, and realization of the performance potential of PIC products. Cajamarca delivers a blend of academia & institutional knowledge to his customers/partners through customized programs, which include: production practices, performance improvement initiatives, genetic dissemination and specific technical and/or research projects.



Speaker Lindsay Case, Ph.D.

Lindsay Case is director of new product commercialization at PIC North America. She helps producers and the broader pork chain unlock new value through genetic innovation. She leads the efforts to bring the PRRS-resistant pig to market in approved countries and to quantify and communicate the environmental benefits enabled by genetic improvement – what PIC calls "Genetic Carbon." Since joining PIC in 2011, Case has held leadership roles in genetic services, commercial operations, and international teams. This experience has given her a deep understanding of the science and business of animal genetics, as well as the cultural and economic forces shaping the global pork industry. Case is passionate about advancing the sustainability, resilience, and productivity of livestock production by improving animal health, welfare, and the efficient production of high-quality protein. She holds a doctorate in genetics from the University of Guelph and an MBA from the University of Michigan.



Speaker Yolanda Castelo

Yolanda Castelo is the performance support services manager at Topigs Norsvin USA, leading the team to help pork producers nationwide implement genetic strategies and improve herd performance. She spent 22 years at Smithfield Hog Production in leadership roles, holds a B.A. from Zamorano University, an M.S. from the University of Florida and an MBA from East Carolina University.



Speaker Sara Crawford, Ph.D.

Sara Crawford, an Ohio native, serves as senior vice president of the Eocene Environmental Group, where she provides executive leadership focused on sustainability, regenerative agriculture, and food-system innovation. Since joining Eocene in 2022, she has brought deep expertise in agriculture, animal and meat sciences, and environmental stewardship to support solutions across the food supply chain. Prior to Eocene, Crawford served as vice president of sustainability for the National Pork Board, where she helped advance science-based sustainability initiatives for the U.S. pork industry centered on on-farm sustainability benchmarking for continuous improvement. Her experience also includes roles as a vendor specialist with OSI Group and as department chair of the animal sciences program at Delaware Valley University. Crawford holds a doctorate in animal sciences, along with master's and bachelor's degrees, from The Ohio State University.



Speaker Dave Murray

Dave Murray serves as vice president of livestock procurement for Indiana Packers Corporation in Delphi, Indiana. There, he is responsible for sourcing hogs and maintaining strong relationships with pork producers across the region. In this role, Murray works closely with producers, markets, and internal teams to ensure a reliable supply chain that supports animal well-being, operational efficiency, and long-term business sustainability. Prior to joining Indiana Packers, he gained valuable industry experience with Mariah Packing, further strengthening his understanding of procurement, processing, and producer-packer collaboration. With this breadth of experience in livestock procurement and pork production, Murray has a practical understanding of the challenges and opportunities facing today's producers. His work emphasizes transparency, collaboration, and data-driven decision-making. He holds a bachelor's degree from Hanover College.



Speaker Leo Feler, Ph.D.

Leo Feler, Ph.D., is chief economist at Numerator, a consumer research firm, and visiting economist at the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago. Feler regularly briefs c-suite executives of Fortune 500 companies on the state of the U.S. consumer and implications of policy changes on consumer behavior and the U.S. economy. Together with economists at the Federal Reserve, Feler developed a "Better Way of Understanding the U.S. Consumer." Feler's research focuses on understanding how consumers react to changing economic conditions, how consumers perceive the economy, and how their perceptions often differ from reality, using a representative panel of U.S. households to track what consumers say and do in real-time. Feler is featured regularly in popular media such as *The New York Times*, *Wall Street Journal*, *Washington Post*, *Los Angeles Times*, *Time Magazine*, CNN, PBS NewsHour, NBC News, and CBS News. Feler has been a keynote speaker at several conferences around the world, including presentations with the Food Industry Association, World50, Unilever, Hershey, Coca-Cola, Reynolds Consumer Products, and many other consumer packaged goods companies.




Speaker Anna Forseth, DVM

Anna Forseth, DVM, is the director of animal health with the National Pork Producers Council (NPPC). Forseth and the NPPC team represent pork producers and 42 affiliated state pork associations, advocating for the social, environmental, and economic sustainability of the U.S. pork industry. In her role, Forseth is responsible for pre-harvest animal health issues including foreign animal disease prevention and preparedness, biotechnology, and swine welfare. A Montana native who grew up on the family's farrow-to-finish swine operation, Forseth received a bachelor's degree in animal science from Montana State University, her DVM from Colorado State University and a master's in veterinary preventive medicine from Iowa State University.



Speaker Iain Harris

Iain Harris represents Fine Swine and serves as a board member of the Ohio Pork Council. Raised on a pig farm in England, Harris pursued his goal of building a career in American pork production and now brings more than four decades of professional experience to the industry. He has spent the past 20 years with Fine Swine, where he oversees all areas of production across a large sow system, with most farms located in Ohio. Harris is known for his ability to identify farm-level operational efficiencies that improve animal care, employee engagement, and overall performance. He places strong emphasis on leadership development and helping teams understand the "why" behind operational decisions. His goal is to deliver practical, people-first outcomes that are best for the entire farm. He and his wife Lori have three adult children.



Speaker Liane Hart

Liane has 30 years of experience in the animal health industry and is considered an expert in her field. She has designed and led successful multi-million dollar global product launches, portfolio strategies, new business developments, in-market planning, and is also well versed in regulatory affairs. While the majority of her recent accomplishments are in equine and companion animal, she is also very proficient and skilled in the beef, dairy and swine markets. Speaker **Bethany Heitkamp, DVM**

Cooper Farms has 30,000 sows and raises 800,000 market pigs a year. In addition to the pigs, Cooper Farms grows 6 million heavy turkey toms a year and houses 8 million layers. Before Cooper Farms, Heitkamp worked with Four Star Veterinary Service in Chickasaw, Ohio, with Dr. Bill Minton. Heitkamp achieved her veterinary degree from The Ohio State University College of Veterinary Medicine. Heitkamp lives with her husband, Kurt, and their three children, Emma, Audrey, and Lucas, on their farm in Maria Stein, Ohio.



Speaker **Ashley Hengen**

Ashley Hengen is a human resources manager with PIC, where she has spent nearly eight years supporting global supply chain, production, and technical teams across the pork industry. Her work focuses on strengthening employee engagement, improving retention, and building high-performing teams within complex production environments. Hengen has led people-focused initiatives that have significantly reduced turnover and enhanced workforce stability. Prior to joining PIC, she worked with the Government of Saskatchewan in public housing, where she developed a strong interest in policy development and organizational improvement. Speaker Pat Hord

Pat Hord serves as CEO of Hord Family Farms, a fifth-generation family farming operation located in Ohio, Pennsylvania, Minnesota, and surrounding states. The farm produces corn, soybeans, wheat, and hay, in addition to its sow and wean-to-finish units. Other enterprises include beef cattle and grain elevators. The company employs 350 team members and partners with over 200 farmer swine growers. Hord currently serves on the National Pork Producers Council board of directors as vice president and represents producers on multiple NPPC committees. He also serves on Ohio-based Wendy's animal wellbeing committee. Hord's local leadership includes the Ohio Pork Producers Council executive committee, Crawford County Economic Development Board, and the Lifewise Academy board. He is also a member of Crossroads Church. Hord and his wife Janel are parents of four children and five grandchildren.



Speaker Bryan Humphreys

Bryan Humphreys serves as chief executive officer of the National Pork Producers Council, where he leads the organization's policy, advocacy, and operational efforts. Raised on his family's farm in Iowa, Humphreys brings a firsthand understanding of challenges facing producers. Prior to becoming CEO, he served as a senior vice president at the National Pork Board, helping guide producer outreach and strengthen industry relationships. He previously served as executive vice president of the Ohio Pork Council, leading award-winning producer image campaigns and building strong partnerships. Humphreys also held an earlier role at NPPC as director of grassroots operations, after his time working at the party level in Minnesota on political campaigns – all of which equips him well to effectively navigate today's increasingly complex and politicized regulatory environment. 


Speaker **Melanie Langley**

Speaker David Newman, Ph.D.

David Newman serves as chief executive officer of the National Pork Board, where he leads Pork Checkoff-funded promotion, research, and education efforts on behalf of the nation's nearly 60,000 pork producers. Prior to becoming CEO, Newman led the organization's market growth team, overseeing initiatives focused on domestic and international demand development, as well as pork's role in health and nutrition. Earlier in his career, he held faculty positions at North Dakota State University and Arkansas State University, where he provided leadership in meat science and swine research programs. Newman is a former president of the National Pork Board's board of directors and has served in multiple governance roles. 
Speaker **Terri Specht-Benson, DVM**




